	Item 2: Police Report: Cllr Lamont had sent a report for the meeting, covering matters he	
	actioned after the last meeting. He informed that the Data Traffic Survey had now concluded	
	and he is chasing this up. He had requested traffic patrols in the area.	AL

5	New Bus Timetable	
	The new bus timetable, following the refusal of Stagecoach to renew its contract with	
	Dumfries & Galloway Council, had caused great disappointment within Barrhill, with a	
	resident raising the matter with the CC. When Girvan Academy is on holiday, there are now	
	only 2 buses a day in each direction. Timings are inconvenient, with in one case only 5	
	minutes in Newton Stewart for shopping etc. Cancellation of the 5.30pm bus from Girvan in	
	particular, which is used by pupils attending after-school activities, is causing distress.	
	ACk and AL had raised this with both SAC's Education Director and the Portfolio for	
	Education Councillor responsible for school transport.	
	ACk queried if Stinchar Connections could help and JB will look into this. ACk will also	JB/
	pursue the matter. The Police entered the room at 7.25pm.	ACk
2	Police Report	

PCs McKinlay and Thorne were in attendance and gave the report for the period from 26th June to 27th August. There were 8 incidents during this period with details as follows: False Call: 1; Assist Members of the Public: 1; Road Traffic Matters: 2; Drones: 1 (Forestry Officers); Abandoned Vehicles: 1; Police Info: 1; and Suspected Persons: 1. There were no crime reports from these calls. During questions JT referred to a stolen digger up the Knowe Road. CS asked about delays for turbine deliveries - the previous week delays of 45/60 minutes had been experienced when the community was led to believe delays should be roughly 20 mins. Traffic management depends on when Police Scotland have the manpower to do this. CS enquired if there had been any reports of sheep rustling. She had been informed of 3 farms - one in D & G - where sheep had been stolen. No comlaints received to date. **Treasurer's Report** 6 AC circulated his report. CC funds in the bank now show a total of £20,365.97, following the receipt of almost £5K funding from SPEN's Biodiversity CVP Fund, for MR's Red Suirrel project. Expenditure included web hosting costs and consumables. The CF balance is now at £9,773.03, resulting in an overall bank balance of £30,139.00. AC was thanked for his report. 7 **Updates** a) BCIC: JT informed that work continues to progress with the Net Zero/Barrhill Greener **Homes** project, with funding available for eighteen months. Interviews have been held to appoint a Development Officer to undertake the work, paid for by SPR, which Hubbub will oversee. There will be an information sheet to fill in for residents, with reports being made on individual houses b) BDT: AC informed that the search for a tenant for the Cross Water continues. Four individuals had now visited to look round. Two were not suitable and while the other two were possible, no further contact from them had been received. The arrival of someone who had undertaken to fit the cooker had been delayed. c) Carrick Futures: JB had attended his first meeting in July as a director on behalf of the CC. He informed that Dailly is now part of the communities represented on the Board. The meeting was a funding round with over £860K being available to allocate. There had been 15 applications for funding and over £227,000 was awarded, with 2 applications not awarded and 3 deferred. d) South Ayrshire Health & Social Care Locality Planning Partnership (SAHSCP LPP): CS reported there was no meeting in July and the main items from the minutes of the 20th August meeting were as follows: Promoting Good Mental Health & Wellbeing: Presentation on Adult Carers' Strategy **Engagement** - this is being refreshed, with the draft out for consultation - result hopefully out in October; Locality Plan: Stuart Marshall informed that this needs refreshing, with a bridging plan in place for 12 to 18 months while work to create the new plan progresses over the next 2-3 years – SM 'wants to create synergy between the Locality Plan and Community-led Action Plans to impact on Health & Well-being'; Funding/Mentors: 13 applicants so far for Small Grants Funding, with the deadline of 22nd August to be discussed on 10th September: agreed to provide mentors to assist successful groups; Health Event – to take place on Satuday 4th October at Girvan Hospital between 10am & 3pm - provision of transport from the villages being looked at; Girvan Hospital Review: to be presented shortly to the SPAG meeting; Community Transport - another 6 monhs funding received, with a new timetable scheduled for September; Updates - VASA there wil be a Social Fit Event in Barrhill on 10th September, 1-3pm; First Responders received 2 call - outs and now have a new training programme. e) Kilgallioch Community Fund: MR had nothing to report as there had not been a meeting. JT informed, as did CS, that regretfully Ann Robertson, the non-CC director on this Board, had decided to resign at the forthcoming AGM, after 8 years. JT asked if any of the members of the public present would be willing to take up this position. Gillian JT Young volunteered and was thanked by JT. who will inform Foundation Scotland, Noted. f) Kilgallioch & Arecleoch Extensions Community Benefit: JT informed that SPR anticipate completion of the turbine deliveries by the second week in September. He and AC had attended a meeting immediately prior to the CC meeting to discuss the contract between the communities involved in the draft Community Benefit agreement, which

	reflects the amount agreed between the communities. To be finalised. g) Barrhill Events Group: PMcG informed that the windowbox competition 'Barrhill in Bloom' takes place on Friday, with the Car Treasure Hunt on Saturday evening. The reformed Gardening Club meets on 17 th September and PMcG also reported that the recent McDonald Bros concert had been a great success.

	Incl. Whiteminwhill Energy Park request for Scoping Opinion	
	Whiteminwhill Energy Park request for Scoping Opinion for proposed Section 36 application by Voltalia: (windfarm/solar farm/battery energy storage system (BESS)). JT declared an interest in this item, vacated the Chair and left the meeting, taking no part in the discussions. The Vice-Chair, JB, then took the Chair for this item. He commenced by giving the background to this item, explaining that the CC had reached a decision on this by email, having to submit comments by 18th July. He then read out the CC's submitted comments, which stated that the CC was following its usual stance and not commenting on scoping, preferring to wait for the actual planning application. Several members of the public were present for this item and JB invited each to address the meeting and to give their names prior to speaking. The first resident expressed her serious concerns as to how this proposed development would affect her, already suffering detrimental effects from the existing windfarms, which have greatly affected her health and well-being. Should this go ahead, she will be completely surrounded by turbines but was not a consultee and had difficulty in obtaining the information. She eventually received help to pass on her objections. Amongst these was the fact that the information in the document was completely out of date. She recalled the struggles involved 10 years ago in opposing the previous proposal for the Altercannoch Windfarm on the same site, which was rejected on appeal, and viewed the prospect of repeating this fight with dread. JB summarised her objections: previous refusal on the same site; far too near dwellings; excessive height and detrimental health aspects of the Energy Park. felt that the Community Council had missed an opportunity to object and asked for ACk's views on the matter. ACk informed that SAC does not comment on scoping and stressed the fact that scoping is not a planning application. There will be ample opportunity to register objections once the application has been submitted in 2026. AC	ACk
