	in its decision not to comment on the scoping. He had contacted the Energy Secretary and	
	SAC. He informed that SAC had after all commented on the scoping, after asking for an	
	extension and he asked that the CC do likewise; comment on the scoping and also ensure	
	that in future the CC makes a point of commenting on any scoping consultations. A lively discussion ensued, with members endeavouring to explain the reasoning behind the

6	Treasurer's Report	
	AC circulated his report. CC funds in the bank now show a total of £19,863.14, following the receipt of Carrick Futures annual £5K funding for Small Grants. SPEN's Biodiversity CVP Fund, for MR's Red Suirrel project, is also included as before. Expenditure included the annual Information Commissioner's fee. The CF balance is now at £13,785, following payment for 'Poo bags'. Overall bank balance is £33,648.89. <i>AC was thanked for his report</i> .	
7	Updates a) BCIC: JT again informed that work continues to progress with the Net Zero/Barrhill	
	 Greener Homes project. A Development Officer, Fiona Limbrey, has now been appointed to undertake the work, overseen by Hubbub. The project will launch on 15th November, at the Community Energy Grants and Greener Homes event in the Memorial Hall. b) BDT: AC informed that at long last it is hoped that the saga of the Cross Water pub has been resolved. The cooker is now installed and tenants have now been found and are full of ideas how to take the pub forward. The contract is to be signed shortly and following problems with the licence due to a mix-up when the BDT took over from BCIC, a provisional licence is in place, with hopes that the pub can reopen by Christmas. LK declared an interest as he is a member of the Licensing Board. Noted. c) Carrick Futures: In his absence JB had forwarded the communication from the last CF meeting, regarding the successful grant recipients. It was noted that among these was the Ayrshire Rivers Trust regarding Japanese Knotweed control on the River Stinchar, which includes the tributaries i.e. the Duisk. d) South Ayrshire Health & Social Care Locality Planning Partnership (SAHSCP LPP): CS reported the main items from the minutes of the meeting on 10th September. Alcohol & Drugs Partnership (ADP): Presentation on this, informing of the support across South Ayrshire. ADP will be represented at the LPP meetings in future. Support Groups: Recovery Ayr, Connexions and Compass – hope to extend Compass to rural South Carrick; Harbour Ayrshire. There is a growing demand for recovery groups in rural areas – recent funding received from Kilgallioch Windfarm Benefit Fund and Carrick Futures. One to one support is given; Funding/Mentors: Recipients to be notified shortly; Health Event – to take place on Saturday 4th October at Girvan Hospital between 10am & 3pm; Cosy Spaces, Girvan – recommences on Tuesday 28th October – weekly. 8th October Meeting: Presentation on Communications Friendly Environments - a project started in August 2024,	
	 Ayr Hospital heart clinic (none at Crosshouse) so hope to commence a clinic at Girvan: VASA - good attendance at the event in the Wave Hub; Over to You packs discussed. E) Kilgallioch Community Benefit Fund: MR informed that the meeting was next week, so he had nothing to report. He had been unable to attend the AGM but members AC and CS had done so, as had the retiring director Ann Robertson. Unfortunately, her replacement as a director, Gillian Young, could not attend, due to a delay with Foundation Scotland's paperwork. She will hopefully attend the forthcoming meeting with MR. F) Kilgallioch & Arecleoch Extensions Community Benefit: Turbine deliveries have now
